THE WORD OF GOD

From the Old Testament Jonah 1:4-17

⁴ But the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. ⁵ Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep. ⁶ So the captain came and said to him, "What do you

mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

⁷And they said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. ⁸ Then they said to him, "Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?" ⁹ And he said to them, "I am a Hebrew, and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." ¹⁰ Then the men were exceedingly afraid and said to him, "What is this that you have done!" For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them.

¹¹ Then they said to him, "What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?" For the sea grew more and more tempestuous. 12 He said to them, "Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you." 13 Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them. 14 Therefore they called out to the LORD, "O LORD, let us not perish for this man's life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O LORD, have done as it pleased you." 15 So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. ¹⁶ Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly. and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made vows.

¹⁷ And the LORD appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Today's Thought on Jonah...

We continue our journey with Jonah this Sunday as we see what happens when Jonah makes a "run for it!" Jonah thinks he can "get away from God" and nothing could be further from the truth!

A few additional facts about Jonah sailing to Tarshish – Spain. A that time, a sea voyage to Tarshish took almost a year with stops at ports of call on the way. Jonah was on a flight from God and any responsibilities.

As the boat sets sail for a year long journey, Jonah has gone down to his room and has fallen asleep. He is unaware of everything that is happening around him. This guy sleeps soundly but not because all is well, he thinks he is safe, but God is God!

When is awoken by the Captain and told "pray to your god," Jonah comes up to the deck and sees what is happening. He confesses his faith and says, "the only way to stop this storm is to throw me overboard." The sailors don't want to throw Jonah into the water, so they try on their own to row back to port. Finally, they relent and throw Jonah overboard and the sea becomes calm.

Contrast this to the Apostle Paul's adventure in Acts 27:23-25. Paul is sailing for Rome and a violent storm over takes the boat. Paul comes forth and declares that an Angel from God had told him that all would be saved. Paul has a confidence in God and gives hope to the crew.

That kind of courage comes from consistent communion with God. That is what Jonah lacked because of his disobedience. If Jonah knew that the storm was God's judgment on him, why didn't he either set things right with God or get off the ship? Instead, Jonah made the sailors responsible.

The sailors eventually saw that God was Yahweh who was indeed sovereign of the sea. Jonah would not go to Nineveh to prophesy to the Gentiles there, but he is caught in a situation in his escape in which Gentile sailors believed in Yahweh because of his brief

witness that Yahweh, the God of heaven, made the sea and dry land. God intended to use the prophet regardless of his resistance. There was no escape!
